Dear Secretary Bose:

Pursuant to Section (§) 5.5 of Title 18 of the Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.), the South Sutter Water District (SSWD), a special district under California State law, gives notice to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC or Commission) of SSWD's intent to file an application for a new license for the Camp Far West Hydroelectric Project, FERC Project Number (No.) 2997 (Project), on, or before, June 30, 2019. SSWD is the existing licensee and current owner and operator of the Project.

The initial license for the Project was issued by FERC to SSWD on July 2, 1981, effective on July 1, 1981 for a period of 40 years.

Information required under 18 C.F.R. Sections 5.5 and 16.6(b) and other useful information concerning the Project is provided below.

In addition, this letter requests the FERC authorize SSWD as FERC's non-federal representative for carrying out informal consultation, pursuant to Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act (ESA) and Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA).

Simultaneously with the filing of this Notice of Intent (NOI), under separate cover SSWD has e-Filed with FERC a Pre-Application Document (PAD) in conformance with 18 C.F.R. Section 5.6 and a letter requesting FERC's authorization for SSWD to use FERC's traditional process to relicense the Project.

UNEQUIVOCAL STATEMENT OF INTENT TO FILE AN APPLICATION FOR A NEW LICENSE

SSWD's intent is to file with the FERC an Application for New License – Major Project (Existing Dam) for the Camp Far West Hydroelectric by June 30, 2019 - two years prior to the expiration of the existing FERC license.

TYPE OF PRINCIPAL PROJECT WORKS LICENSED

The Camp Far West Hydroelectric Project consists of one development – Camp Far West – whose principal works include:

- Camp Far West Dam, a 185-foot (ft) high, 2,070 ft long, and 40 ft wide at the crest, zoned earthfill dam located on the Bear River approximately 18.2 miles (mi) upstream of the confluence of the Bear River with the Feather River;
- Three small earthfill dams, an earthern wing dam 45 ft high, with a crest length of 1,060 ft and a width of 20 ft, located adjacent to the left abutment of the Camp Far West Dam; a second earthern wing dam 25 ft high, with a crest length of 1,460 ft and a width of 20 ft, located north of the Camp Far West Dam across from the spillway; and an earthern dike 15 ft high, with a crest length of 1,450 ft and a width of 20 ft, located adjacent to second wing dam;
- <u>Camp Far West Reservoir</u>, a 2,020 surface acre (ac) reservoir with a gross storage capacity of 93,740 acre-feet (ac-ft) and a shoreline length of 29 mi at a normal maximum water surface elevation (NMWSE) of 300 ft;
- <u>Camp Far West Dam Spillway</u>, an ungated ogee-type concrete overflow spillway adjacent to the right abutment of the dam with a crest length of 300 ft and a capacity of 106,500 cubic feet per second (cfs);
- Camp Far West Low-Level Intake, Tunnel and Outlet, with a submerged intake on Camp Far West Reservoir consisting of a reinforced concrete ungated vertical intake tower 25 ft 4 in. high, with openings on three sides each 7 ft wide by 8 ft high. The openings are

protected by steel trashracks on 6-in. centers. The sill elevation is at 175.0 ft. A 350 ft long 48-in. diameter steel pipe connects the intake to a valve chamber, and a 400-ft long, 7.5-ft diameter concrete-lined horseshoe tunnel connects the valve chamber to a 48-in. diameter Howell Bunger outlet valve on the downstream face of Camp Far West Dam. The valve has a release capacity of 500 cfs and discharges directly into the Bear River;

- Camp Far West Power Intake and Tunnel, with a submerged intake structure consisting of a reinforced concrete ungated vertical intake tower 22 ft- high, with openings on three sides two 10 ft wide by 14 ft high and one 10 ft wide by 10 ft high. The openings are protected by steel trashracks on 6-in. centers. The sill elevation is at 197.0 ft. The intake connects to a 760-ft long, 8-ft diameter concrete tunnel through the left abutment of Camp Far West Dam that conveys water directly to the Camp Far West Powerhouse;
- <u>Camp Far West Powerhouse</u>, a 45-ft wide and 60-ft long concrete powerhouse containing
 one vertical Kaplan 9,000-horsepower (HP) turbine and one generator rated at 6,800
 kilowatts (kW), 0.9 power factor, 60 Hertz, 13.8 kilovolts (kV), and a rated flow of 750
 cfs;
- Camp Far West Switchyard, a fenced switchyard adjacent to the Camp Far West Powerhouse containing a 6/8 megavolt-amperes (MVA), open-air circulation/forced-air circulation (OH/FA), three phase, 13.8 kV 60 kV, delta-ground wye power step-up transformer; a 60 kV, 31, 60 Marts, 600 ampere, 1,000 MVA short circuit bulk oil circuit breaker; and appropriate disconnect switches. The switchyard also contains Pacific Gas and Electric Company electrical equipment facilities that are not part of the Project;
- North and South Recreation Areas, two recreation areas, each located on the Camp Far West Reservoir shoreline; and
- Appurtent Facilities, including roads and gages.

The Project does not include any open water conveyance facilities, transmission lines, or active borrow or spoil areas. Nor does the Project include the diversion dam located 1.3 miles downstream from Camp Far West Dam, or SSWD's Conveyance Canal or Camp Far West Irrigation District's Canal, or the intake structures to these water delivery canals, located immediately upstream of the non-Project diversion dam.

The Project's existing FERC Boundary includes approximately 2,863.7 ac of land; the boundary includes no federal land nor is any federal land adjacent to the boundary or on the Bear River downstream of the Project.
